- African American Kenyan Women's Interconnect (AAKEWO)

Purpose of AAKEWO

- Action arm of Cultural Reconnection Missions
 - Support Joint Ventures with Kenyar women
 - Establish/Strengthen <u>ties</u> & <u>build</u> <u>relationships</u> with African people & African land
 - Contribute to reversing the conditions that led to cultural <u>dis</u>connection for women in the diaspora

Why Sustainable Joint Ventures?

Joint Ventures:

- Are a natural progression of participating in a CRM
- Launch efforts that delegates feel passionate about
- Are a source for identifying & securing support for jointventure initiatives with Africans
- Are one method of empowering ourselves & others by putting our money together to benefit our brothers & sisters in the Motherland
- Provide opportunities to get more than we give even when it appears that the opposite is true

SJV Criteria

- We select joint ventures that:
 - Have a custodian
 - Be sustainable
 - Build capacity
 - Promote positive images of Africa & Africans
 - Empower people of African descent
 - Have ability for AAKEWO to help bring to fruition
 - Focus on the overall well-being of the people of Africa
 - Provide more opportunities for cultural reconnection
- Joint ventures may:
 - Involve education & caring for children, their families & their environment
 - Enhance economic development

Rubric

- Developed by the Institute for Cultural Reconnection
- Assessment tool used to
 - Identify & promote best practices
 - Determine what is/will be successful
 - Ensure consistency in evaluating proposals for proposed SJVs
- Serves as a culturally competent lens for SJVs

- Books for
 - 1 Regional Library (Wene Ndalo in Nyanza Province)
 - 6 Public Schools in rural Nyanza Province
 - Women's Center in Kibera Slum



40-foot Container

60,000 Books for

- To establish Wenendalo Memorial Library in rural Nyanza Province, Karachuonyo District
- Libraries for 6 rural schools
- Ombogo Girls Academy Library
- Women's Group Headquarters in Kibera Slum (Nairobi)



Alta Brim Orphanage Home 40 children

- 200 chickens
- 2 cows, 1 calf
- Water tank
- Septic system
- Toilets & Showers
- Lessons learned

With Duong'a Women's Group


Harambe for 18 water tanks + 40

Kanyamfwa (Village) School Harambe

- Water tank
- \$4,000 for Secondary School Text Books
- Funding to build lunchroom
- Library books from the container



Ombogo Girls Academy

- Scholarship Endowment Fund
 - Individual Contributors: \$500 lifetime
- Personal supplies (sanitary, toiletries, etc.)
- Pen Pal Program



Our Model Requires That We...

- Connect with existing African organizations
- Build on-going relationships with people who have good track records
 - Women's Groups
 - Community activists
 - Individuals
 - Elders
 - NGOs
- Visit joint ventures sites annually; they know we are coming back; they look forward to seeing us

Joint Ventures That Make Sense For Us

- Technical Assistance
- Textbooks & school supplies
- Medical supplies
- Libraries
- Water tanks
- Dormitories
- Solar energy
- Computers & internet access
